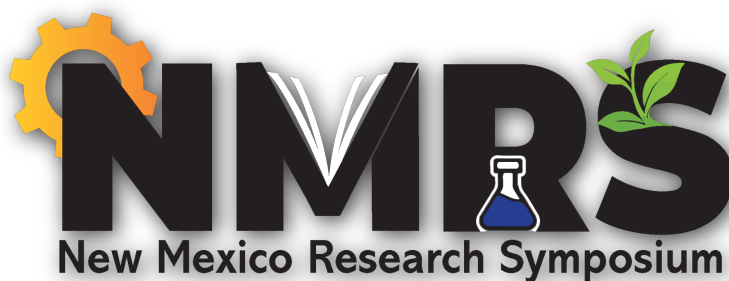


CALL FOR ABSTRACTS

The 2022 NMRS poster competition and oral presentation sessions will be in-person. All student posters will be entered into the poster competition and eligible to earn prizes in undergraduate and graduate categories. Oral presentations take place from 9:00–10:15. Poster judging will take place from 10:30–noon where you will stand beside your poster and interact with judges and attendees. ELIGIBILITY

To be eligible to present, you must be [registered for the symposium](#). Abstract submissions for oral and poster presentations are due by **October 17, 2022**.

Abstracts will be reviewed, and accepted presenters will be notified by **October 21, 2022**. All accepted abstracts have the option to be published in the *2022 New Mexico Journal of Science*. View past *New Mexico Journal of Science* issues at www.nmas.org.

GUIDELINES FOR SUBMISSION

- Abstracts must be uploaded during [registration](#) in the text box.
- Please ensure during registration you submit an abstract for the correct session type (oral, poster, or both).
- Abstracts should contain: General topic statement; Problem addressed; Summary of state of the field; Research methods; Results; Implication/impact
- Carefully review abstract before submission for any spelling, grammatical, and typographical errors.
- Submissions should be no longer than 250 words, with 3-5 keywords.
- Use active voice, and write clearly and concisely. **Avoid jargon.**

ORAL PRESENTATIONS:

- An **oral** presentation provides the problem statement, objectives, methods and data, results and conclusions of your original research using visual presentation software.
- Each oral presentation is allotted 20 minutes including questions & discussion.
- Computers and projectors for oral presentations are provided.

POSTER PRESENTATIONS:

- A **poster** presentation is a visual presentation of a problem statement, objectives, methods and data, results, and conclusions of your original research.
- Presenters are expected to print their own posters.
- Posters are exhibited for informal browsing with opportunities for individual discussion with poster authors.
- **Posters must be 4' wide x 3' long (48"x36"). Posters that do not meet these size requirements may be subject to disqualification.**
- Room for poster presentations will be provided at no charge.
- All student posters will be judged for an opportunity to win prizes!
